Be a part of this irreverent and inspirational rock musical directed by Bianca Till. It follows iconic Kiwi suffragist Kate Sheppard and the movement she led to make New Zealand the first country in the world to grant women the vote.

The show is framed as a rock concert for Kate and her 'gang' to tell us her story & the story of New Zealand's suffrage movement. We see her and her friends transition from temperance to suffrage, taking on the anti-suffrage Prime Minister of the day, Richard "King Dick" Seddon and ultimately persuading a quarter of the female population to sign a crucial petition. But behind the public persona her personal life was in turmoil - trapped in a loveless marriage, in love with her best friend and deprived of her only child when she needed him most.

Male or Female. Comedy chops, strong and flexible musical theatre voice.



Waihi Drama Society worked closely with Hauraki District Council earlier this month for A NIGHT AT THE MUSEUM and I would like to thank those who volunteered to help. We really did bring the Museum to life and lots of families came through. Coromandel FM promoted Waihi Drama Society which was great.

We continue to apply for funding for converting our toilets to include a disabled Toilet but as yet have not been successful. It is very important to us that everyone is able to attend the theatre with the correct facilities.

As many of you will know we are an Incorporated Society. A non for-profit legal entity. "Being Incorporated means that individual members are not liable for the Society's debt or other obligations." New legislation requires Waihi Drama Society to reregister for incorporation before April 2026. So at our next AGM in June, we will be discussing if we want to remain an Incorporated Society or not. I will be gathering some information for our members so that an informed choice can be made.
